
The Lord's Supper

1 Corinthians 11:19


God allows certain things to happen for a reason.



For I received from the Lord what I also passed on to you: 1 Corinthians 11: 23



It's a Metaphor (It remains BREAD)

- Because 1. Jesus hands were holding it at the time
 - Jesus used similar language before (eg I am the vine, the door, the gate)
 - the Passover feast where it first happened was a memorial feast

Is it the bread that counts or what happens to it?






Then the two told what had happened on the way, and how Jesus was recognized by them when he broke the bread.

It isn't a wafer -> no crumbs

What is the bread meant to represent?

my body, which is broken for you





Because there is one loaf, we, who are many, are one body, for we all share the one loaf.

1Cor.10:17



In the same way, after supper he took the cup, saying, "This cup is the new covenant in my blood;"

1 Corinthians 11:25

The cup is the means for us to share the wine.



It's a Metaphor (It remains WINE)

- Because 1. Jesus hands were holding it at the time
 - Jesus says that it's the CUP and its contents that represent the New Covenant A new relationship with the Lord
 - 3. "in my blood" is equivalent to "broken"

They point us to Jesus and his sacrificial death for us

Something to be repeated




in remembrance of me

The focus is on Jesus

For whenever you eat this bread and drink this cup, you proclaim the Lord's death until he comes. 1 Corinthians 11:26

Proclaim - a confession of our faith: We believe he died,
was buried,
rose again,
ascended into heaven,
will return in glory

So then, whoever eats the bread or drinks the cup of the Lord in an unworthy manner will be guilty of sinning against the body and blood of the Lord.

1 Corinthians 11:27

This is a serious matter not to be taken casually or as something ordinary

Mistreating the representation means
Mistreating what it represents



Everyone ought to examine themselves before they eat of the bread and drink from the cup.

1 Corinthians 11:28



ought to examine

Attitude to others, known unconfessed sin

Before: - not worthy = OK sense of brokenness and need = OK

For those who eat and drink without discerning the body of Christ eat and drink judgment on themselves. 1 Corinthians 11:29

"discerning the body of Christ"

Recognizing and respecting that this represents Jesus and what he has done for you

If not, you will arouse God's displeasure and there are consequences!



That is why many among you are weak and sick, and a number of you have fallen asleep. But if we were more discerning with regard to ourselves, we would not come under such judgment.

1 Corinthians 11:30-31










Nevertheless, when we are judged in this way by the Lord, we are being disciplined so that we will not be finally condemned with the world.

So then, my brothers and sisters, when you gather to eat, you should all eat together. Anyone who is hungry should eat something at home, so that when you meet together it may not result in judgment.


