




"Choose a man to come down to me. If he is able kill me, we will become your slaves; but if I kill him, you will become our slaves."


On hearing Goliath's words, King Saul and all the Israelites were terrified.

The Lord who rescued me from the paws of the lion and the bear will rescue me from this Philistine.






Then Saul put a coat of armour on him and a bronze helmet on his head.

Then he took his staff in his hand, chose five smooth stones from the stream, put them in the pouch of his shepherd's bag and, with his sling in his hand, approached Goliath.







Meanwhile, the Philistine, with his shield bearer in front of him, kept coming closer to David. He looked at David and saw that he was just a 'boy', and he despised him.

Their dead were strewn all along the road to Gath.




How do you think David got to know God so well?
