
When was the flood ?



About 500yrs. before Abraham (about 2000 B.C.) = 2500 B.C.

What happened ?

Noah and his sons, Shem, Ham and Japheth, together with his wife and the wives of his three sons, entered the ark. They had with them every wild animal according to its kind Then the LORD shut him in.

Every living thing that moved on land perished

Water Beneath the Surface

The waters rose and increased greatly on the earth, and the ark floated on the surface of the water. They rose greatly on the earth, and all the high mountains under the entire heavens were covered. The waters rose and covered the mountains to a depth of more than fifteen cubits.

Where the water finished

All the high mountains were covered



Sediments containing fossils. Formed at sea-level, now at 8.8 km above sea level

Metamorphosed sediments. Formed at sea-level, buried 15 kilometres below the surface, now 6 km above sea-level

How long did it last?





In the six hundredth year of Noah's life, on the seventeenth day of the (Noah's)second month--on that day all the springs of the great deep burst forth, and the floodgates of the heavens were opened. 17/2/600

By the first day of the first month of Noah's six hundred and first year, the water had dried up from the earth. 1/1/601

By the twenty-seventh day of the second month the earth was completely dry. **27/2/601**

=

1 year and 10 days

on the seventeenth day of the seventh month ...

on the first day of the **tenth** month

By the first day of the first month of Noah's six hundred and first year






How did it end ?


Now the springs of the deep and the floodgates of the heavens had been closed, and the rain had stopped falling from the sky.

What did it leave behind ?







How did it end ?

Genesis 8:4 and on the seventeenth day of the seventh month the ark came to rest on the mountains of Ararat.

If Noah was born on the Jewish new year's day in September, then the months quoted also correspond to the year's months. So the ark grounded on the 17th of Nisan (Resurrection Day)





He sent out a raven, and it kept flying back and forth until the water had dried up from the earth. Then he sent out a dove to see if the water had receded from the surface of the ground.



Again he sent out the dove from the ark. When the dove returned to him in the evening, there in its beak was a freshly plucked olive leaf!




Genesis 8:13 By the first day of the first month of Noah's six hundred and first year, the water had dried up from the earth.
