

The man who became a proverb




Genesis 11:1

Genesis 11:9 That is why it was called Babel--because there the LORD confused the language of the whole world. From there the LORD scattered them over the face of the whole earth.


God's plan --- Confusion – Protection?

It was founded in rebellion.






God's instrument to chasten his people in their rebellion.

The final focus of rebellion against the Lord.




The beginning of a new united people under God




On the day of Pentecost Acts 2
