Life's little challenges!



When the Egyptians see you, they will say, 'This is his wife.' Then they will kill me but will let you live.




Our imaginations – fears can be self-fulfilling !

Say you are my sister, so that I will be treated well for your sake and my life will be spared because of you.




If you really love me you will But if they take her - she's compromised ! Half- truths work like whole lies.

Did Sarai have a choice?

One lie leads to more problems He treated Abram well for her sake, and Abram acquired sheep and cattle, male and female donkeys, male and female servants, and camels.



Gifts he can't refuse – dowry ?

Notice – the order of "importance" to Egyptians (Egyptians not interested in camels ? – suitable for nomads)

Theses are Bedouin riches.

He's not short now – but it creates more problems later !

God steps in to extricate them from their mess



How long did this state of affairs last ? What kind of diseases ? Why do the innocent suffer ? How did Pharaoh make the connection?

So Pharaoh summoned Abram.




Guilty as accused – his life really is in danger now

What have you done to me?


- * Lied.
