




Why did he move away?

His weak spot exposed—fear of man




He failed her as her husband

Why did he take her?



But God came to Abimelech in a dream one night and said to him, "You are as good as dead because of the woman you have taken; she is a married woman."






An answer to his prayer




God uses our trials to refine us
