


**Genesis chapter 24**

Genesis 24:1


### Things to think about and causes for gratitude Unknown – more time to come



## **Assumptions:**

Abraham had told:
Isaac about God's promises
About the future of the land and its people
About arranging for a wife from his own people

Isaac agreed! 40ys old, very eligible and still not married



He said to the senior servant in his household, the one in charge of all that he had, "Put your hand under my thigh. I want you to swear by the **LORD**, the God of heaven and the God of earth, that you will not get a wife for my son from the daughters of the Canaanites, among whom I am living, but will go to my country and my own relatives and get a wife for my son Isaac."

**Genesis 24:2-4** 


An important task for a trusted – loyal servant -

Make an oath. v. unusual way! (linked to covenant, circumcision?)



The servant asked him, "What if the woman is unwilling to come back with me to this land? Shall I then take your son back to the country you came from?"


Genesis 24:5



He can't make promises for others


"Make sure that you do not take my son back there," Abraham said. "The LORD, the God of heaven, who brought me out of my father's household and my native land and who spoke to me and promised me on oath, saying, 'To your offspring I will give this land'--he will send his angel before you so that you can get a wife for my son from there. If the woman is unwilling to come back with you, then you will be released from this oath of mine. Only do not take my son back there." So the servant put his hand under the thigh of his master Abraham and swore an oath to him concerning this matter. Genesis 24:6-9

This is the place – God took me from there
God made a promise – somehow he will make good
But if she doesn't want to come – the oath ends there.



Then the servant left, taking with him ten of his master's camels loaded with all kinds of good things from his master..

An impressive caravan – representing Abraham and Isaac



He rests the camels


Great care needed to make the right choice See who comes?



Then he prayed, "LORD, God of my master Abraham, make me successful today, and show kindness to my master Abraham.

Genesis 24:12-14

Prayer needed – for God's help. He appeals to God's relationship with Abraham




See, I am standing beside this spring, and the daughters of the townspeople are coming out to draw water. May it be that when I say to a young woman, 'Please let down your jar that I may have a drink,' and she says, 'Drink, and I'll water your camels too'--let her be the one you have chosen for your servant Isaac. By this I will know that you have shown kindness to my master."

Genesis 24:12-14


Need a sign? (BEWARE) Setting conditions? It is not arbitrary. It is a character test (cf. Acts 6)

ie. kind, hospitable, willing to help, not afraid to work





## God's Providence!


She had set off before he started to pray
She arrived just as he had finished praying
She was a niece of Abraham – Isaac's cousin (first qualification)
She was beautiful (another qualification)
She was an unmarried virgin (available as a bride)



The servant hurried to meet her and said, "Please give me a little water from your jar." "Drink, my lord," she said, and quickly lowered the jar to her hands and gave him a drink. After she had given him a drink, she said, "I'll draw water for your camels too, until they have had enough to drink." So she quickly emptied her jar into the trough, ran back to the well to draw more water, and drew enough for all his camels.

Genesis 24:15 -20

The test – she didn't know she was taking. It's quite a task



Without saying a word, the man watched her closely to learn whether or not the LORD had made his journey successful. When the camels had finished drinking, the man took out a gold nose ring weighing a beka and two gold bracelets weighing ten shekels.


Genesis 24:21 -25

Ladies' jewelry






Then he asked, "Whose daughter are you? Please tell me, is there room in your father's house for us to spend the night?" She answered him, "I am the daughter of Bethuel, the son that Milkah bore to Nahor." And she added, "We have plenty of straw and fodder, as well as room for you to spend the night." Genesis 24:21-5



Then the man bowed down and worshiped the LORD, saying, "Praise be to the LORD, the God of my master Abraham, who has not abandoned his kindness and faithfulness to my master. As for me, the LORD has led me on the journey to the house of my master's relatives."

The proper response – this man is a worshipper




The young woman ran and told her mother's household about these things. Now Rebekah had a brother named Laban, and he hurried out to the man at the spring. As soon as he had seen the nose ring, and the bracelets on his sister's arms, and had heard Rebekah tell what the man said to her, he went out to the man and found him standing by the camels near the spring. "Come, you who are blessed by the LORD," he said. "Why are you standing out here? I have prepared the house and a place for the camels."

Genesis 24:28 -31

Laban's warm welcome!

"Blessed by the LORD" –

did he know about Him or
was he just going along?



So the man went to the house, and the camels were unloaded. Straw and fodder were brought for the camels, and water for him and his men to wash their feet. Then food was set before him, but he said, "I will not eat until I have told you what I have to say." "Then tell us," Laban said.

The servant's priorities - do the job or eat?



So he said, "I am Abraham's servant. The LORD has blessed my master abundantly, and he has become wealthy. He has given him sheep and cattle, silver and gold, male and female servants, and camels and donkeys. My master's wife Sarah has borne him a son in her old age, and he has given him everything he owns. And my master made me swear an oath, and said, 'You must not get a wife for my son from the daughters of the Canaanites, in whose land I live, but go to my father's family and to my own clan, and get a wife for my son.'



Abraham's blessings - the LORD, great wealth, a son and heir


**His mission: -** To find a wife for his son among his relatives



"Then I asked my master, 'What if the woman will not come back with me?' "He replied, 'The LORD, before whom I have walked faithfully, will send his angel with you and make your journey a success, so that you can get a wife for my son from my own clan and from my father's family. You will be released from my oath if, when you go to my clan, they refuse to give her to you--then you will be released from my oath.' Genesis 24:39 -41

if you refuse ....



"Before I finished praying in my heart, Rebekah came out, with her jar on her shoulder. She went down to the spring and drew water, and I said to her, 'Please give me a drink.' "She quickly lowered her jar from her shoulder and said, 'Drink, and I'll water your camels too.' So I drank, and she watered the camels also. "I asked her, 'Whose daughter are you?' "She said, 'The daughter of Bethuel son of Nahor, whom Milkah bore to him.' "Then I put the ring in her nose and the bracelets on her arms, Genesis 24:42 -47


He acknowledges God's hand in it. Now you decide – or I'll go elsewhere

Father and brother agree - An arranged marriage



When Abraham's servant heard what they said, he bowed down to the ground before the LORD. Then the servant brought out gold and silver jewelry and articles of clothing and gave them to Rebekah; he also gave costly gifts to her brother and to her mother.



Going with a stranger to marry a stranger in a strange land


## What would you have said?





Genesis 24:62 -65




What's this? – dad's camels She dismounts and shows respect and modesty
