All these were descendants of Keturah.


#### More children!



These are the names of the sons of Ishmael, listed in the order of their birth: Nebaioth the firstborn of Ishmael, Kedar, Adbeel, Mibsam, Mishma, Dumah, Massa, Hadad, Tema, Jetur, Naphish and Kedemah. These were the sons of Ishmael, and these are the names of the twelve tribal rulers according to their settlements and camps. Ishmael lived a hundred and thirty-seven years. He breathed his last and died, and he was gathered to his people. His descendants settled in the area from Havilah to Shur, near the eastern border of Egypt, as you go toward Ashur. 


Note: Egyptians and Africans are not of Arab descent and 'Palestine' (a Roman name) was given by God to Isaac's descendants – the Jews.


What's in a name?





### Esau Sells His Birthright - a bad decision




