
A good or a bad thing?



Now there was a famine in the land, besides the former famine that was in the days of Abraham. And Isaac went to Gerar to Abimelech king of the Philistines.



Genesis 26:2 - 5




God steps in to prevent him (What dad did may not be what God wants you to do)

Abraham's faithful obedience to God






The commandments etc. were not yet written but see Romans 2:14-16 and Hebrews 10:16

Genesis 26:8




Over time he left off his guard?

And Isaac sowed in that land and reaped in the same year a hundredfold. The LORD blessed him, and the man became rich, and gained more and more until he became very wealthy.



And Abimelech said to Isaac, "Go away from us, for you are much mightier than we."



So Isaac departed from there and encamped in the Valley of Gerar and settled there. And Isaac dug again the wells of water that had been dug in the days of Abraham his father, which the Philistines had stopped after the death of Abraham. 
"Opposition"


Encouraging guidance


