




An Amazonian Tribal People

This is the account of Esau (that is, Edom).




Esau's summary – Genesis 36 1, Family – verses 2 - 8



Esau took his wives and sons and daughters and all the members of his household, as well as his livestock and all his other animals and all the goods he had acquired in Canaan, and moved to a land some distance from his brother Jacob. Their possessions were too great for them to remain together; the land where they were staying could not support them both because of their livestock. So Esau (that is, Edom) settled in the hill country of Seir. v6-8

Esau's summary – Genesis 36 2, Leaders – verses 9 - 19


These were the sons of Esau (that is, Edom), and these were their chiefs. v19



Esau's summary – Genesis 36

3, Local peoples – verses 20 - 30

These were the sons of Seir the Horite, who were living in the region v20



Horite = troglodytes

4, Kings- verses 31 - 43

These were the kings who reigned in Edombefore any Israelite king reigned.v31

A useful discovery in the desert


This is the Anah who discovered the hot springs in the desert while he was grazing the donkeys of his father Zibeon. v24

Why is this genealogy included in the Genesis account ?


To show God's faithfulness – Abraham/Isaac's blessing

The Brevity of life – cf first genealogy in Genesis 5





The last genealogy




Summary of all
