


A Personal request

Why did he ask him to swear?

Some time later Joseph was told, "Your father is ill." So he took his two sons Manasseh and Ephraim along with him.




How old would they be by now?

Any children born to you after them will be yours; in the territory they inherit they will be reckoned under the names of their brothers.



Then he blessed **Joseph** and said,



This is the first time God is called a shepherd.



When Joseph saw his father placing his right hand on Ephraim's head he was displeased; so he took hold of his father's hand to move it from Ephraim's head to Manasseh's head. Joseph said to him, "No, my father, this one is the firstborn; put your right hand on his head."

This is the only occasion where Joseph is 'criticized'

Who has the best 'eyesight'?




He too will become a people, and he too will become great. Nevertheless, his younger brother will be greater than he, and his descendants will become a group of nations.

So he put Ephraim ahead of Manasseh.






Then Israel said to Joseph, "I am about to die, but God will be with you and take you back to the land of your fathers.

Romans 4:17 God, who gives life to the dead and calls those things which do not exist as though they did;






For Jacob and his fathers the land became Sites of Special Spiritual Interest
