





# Shechem A Special Place where Abram met with the Lord



Genesis 12:6-7 Abram passed through the land to the place at Shechem, to the oak of Moreh. At that time the Canaanites were in the land. Then the LORD appeared to Abram and said, "To your offspring I will give this land." So he built there an altar to the LORD, who had appeared to him.

# Shechem A Special Place where Jacob met with the Lord



Genesis 33:18-20 And Jacob came safely to the city of Shechem, which is in the land of Canaan, on his way from Paddanaram, and he camped before the city. And from the sons of Hamor, Shechem's father, he bought for a hundred pieces of money the piece of land on which he had pitched his tent. There he erected an altar and called it El-Elohe-Israel.

(God-the God of Israel)

### A Special Place where Israel met with the Lord



Joshua 8:30-31 At that time Joshua built an altar to the LORD, the God of Israel, on Mount Ebal, just as Moses the servant of the LORD had commanded the people of Israel, as it is written in the Book of the Law of Moses, "an altar of uncut stones, upon which no man has wielded an iron tool." And they offered on it burnt offerings to the LORD and sacrificed peace offerings.

## The Living God is not a localised deity


Then Joshua assembled all the tribes of Israel at Shechem. He summoned the elders, leaders, judges and officials of Israel, and they presented themselves before God.

Joshua is speaking for God, giving His perspective and giving Him the glory




### What you started from



God's intervention led to one becoming many



I assigned the hill country of Seir to Esau, but Jacob and his sons went down to Egypt.



The present generation is included in the former generation - one people group History can be 'relived' cf. the Passover








The Exodus redemption from their persecuting masters

I brought you to the land of the Amorites who lived east of the Jordan. They fought against you, but I gave them into your hands. I destroyed them from before you, and you took possession of their land.


He recalls the capture of the east of the Jordan.

Protection and blessing - Are we always aware? We should be grateful.




### **Great miracles**

Then you crossed the Jordan and came to Jericho. The citizens of Jericho fought against you, as did also the Amorites, Perizzites, Canaanites, Hittites, Girgashites, Hivites and Jebusites, but I gave them into your hands.

You entered the land and defeated those 7 nations who attacked you.

## God's psychological warfare!

### One More Lesson from this History

But Abraham only saw a few children and grand children:-For Isaac he had to wait 25 years.

For grand children Jacob and Esau it was an 85 years wait.

The entry to Egypt to the time of Moses took 400 years. Leaving Egypt to enter Canaan was another 40 years. Capturing the land took about 7 years.

Overall, from the promise of the land to its fulfilment at the meeting at Shechem, it took about 600 years!



How many turns?

God keeps his promises – but His timing and ours may be rather different.

## God's timing

This promise to Abraham:-

Genesis 17:19 God said, "No, but Sarah your wife shall bear you a son, and you shall call his name Isaac. I will establish my covenant with him as an everlasting covenant for his offspring after him.

#### to its fulfilment:-

Matthew 1:20-21 an angel of the Lord appeared to him in a dream, saying, "Joseph, son of David, do not fear to take Mary as your wife, for that which is conceived in her is from the Holy Spirit. She will bear a son, and you shall call his name Jesus, for he will save his people from their sins."
