
Jesus' Mission Statement!

LET BATTLE COMMENCE


Jesus' comes to fight :-

Luke 4:31-44 Then he went down to Capernaum, a town in Galilee, and on the Sabbath he taught the people. They were amazed at his teaching, because his words had authority. In the synagogue there was a man possessed by a demon, an impure spirit. He cried out at the top of his voice, "Go away! What do you want with us, Jesus of Nazareth? Have you come to destroy us? I know who you are--the Holy One of God!"



"Be quiet!" Jesus said sternly. "Come out of him!" Then the demon threw the man down before them all and came out without injuring him. All the people were amazed and said to each other, "What words these are! With authority and power he gives orders to impure spirits and they come out!" And the news about him spread throughout the surrounding area.

Demons know who Jesus is! (The devil is no atheist!)

Why?

- 1, He doesn't want demon's testimony.
- 2, They are trying to expose Jesus before he shows the people what the true kind of Messiah he is.

Cf verse 41

Jesus' words of power banishes itand protects and cleanses the man from the impure – unclean spirit.

- spread the word around


2, Sickness and disease

2, Sickness and disease


So he bent over her and rebuked the fever, and it left her. She got up at once and began to wait on them.

He treated things like fever just as if they could hear!




After, she wasn't contagious! Her grateful response. How would she have felt if Jesus had been and gone without her welcoming him to her home?


Various kinds of sickness – instantly & completely healed- as he laid his hands on them.

Jesus' Priorities


3, to fight Ignorance and separation from God

So he "kept on preaching in the synagogues of the Jews".




What priorities govern our lives?
