
The case of the man with leprosy

(Jesus breaks down a gigantic barrier)


"Leprosy" had a religious and social impact for national health

"Anyone with such a defiling disease must wear torn clothes, let their hair be unkempt, cover the lower part of their face and cry out, 'Unclean! Unclean!' As long as they have the disease they remain unclean. They must live alone; they must live outside the camp.

Leviticus 13:45 - 46



Nations where leprosy is endemic



Most new cases occur in 16 countries, with India accounting for more than half.

Many leper colonies have now closed since leprosy is not very contagious, and is treatable with modern drugs.

Leprosy is spread between people. This is believed to occur through a cough or contact with fluid from the nose of an infected person

Leprosy



Initially, infections are without symptoms and typically remain this way for 5 to 20 years. It affects the nerves, respiratory tract, skin, and eyes. This may result in an inability to feel pain and so damage to parts of extremities due to repeated injuries.



The touch demonstrated he was clean!




Jesus compassion – welcome to my world!

- 3, Testimony to 'opposition'?


