


Prophets



2. World Powers





Deuteronomy 18:14-22

A prophet speaks from God to men (present circumstances: surrounding nations; moral state) (future events: judgements and blessings)

Role of prophets to leaders of nation:

in judges (self rule),

during kings period (under God's rule)

return (directions to leaders, priests and people)

'Major' or 'Minor' - all important. The only differences

1, spoken but not written down

2, written (larger works – Isaiah, Jeremiah, Ezekiel, Daniel)

(shorter works - the 'Minor' prophets)

Hosea to Malachi

Enoch - refs. In apocrypha, NT. Jude 14-18

Patriarchs – God appears to Abraham (Gen. 17:1,); Isaac (Gen. 26:24), Jacob (Gen. 28:12-15)

Moses - Deuteronomy 18:14, note special place as a prophet Deuteronomy 34:10

Judges - Judges 6:7-10 (rebuke) Samuel 1 Sam. 3:1 (rare) 1 Sam. 9:9 (formerly known as 'Seer')

Kings - Nathan - promise to David (2 Samuel 7: 4-16), rebuke: (2 Samuel 12:1-7)

Northern tribes (Israel/ Ephraim) Warnings 1 Kings 13:1-5 drift into idolatry, Baal worship warnings --- Hosea, Amos, Elijah (1 Kgs. 18:20), Elisha the Assyrians are coming - Jonah - they have been/ will be judged - Nahum

Southern tribes (Judah & Benjamin)

Warnings & promises - Joel, Isaiah, Micah, (Isaiah 1:1) (warnings - Iast good king - (Zephaniah 1:1), (2 Kings 22:14 – Huldah) Iast warnings – Micah, Habakkuk, Jeremiah 70 years exile – Jeremiah29:1, 10 speaks to remaining people

Exile - Daniel and Ezekiel both taken to Babylon in first phase

Ezekiel – warnings to exiles - Temple destruction (Ezek. 10:1, 24:21) future hope Daniel – lives through exile period (Dan. 1:1, 21) – call to go back.

Foresees future period not written in OT history

Return – 1st phase – Zerubbabel -Ezra 5:1-2 Haggai - build !, Zechariah - future glory (Zech. 2:3-5)

Later - hardening - Malachi - looking for Messiah (Mal. 2:11, 3:1, 4:5)

The Ultimate Prophet Jesus: (Hebrews 1:1-2)
