When was it written? between AD 55 - AD 70 After letter to Romans and before the destruction of the temple in Jerusalem in AD 70

**The Address** -- to Messianic Jews (possibly in Rome)

<u>The Situation</u> – persecution against Christians was intensifying under Nero AD 54-68

It was a very dangerous time for believers.

Dangerous times for believers - An escape route?



<u>For Jews</u> – return to the synagogue (still a safe place) - BUT they were required to deny Jesus is the Messiah

For Gentiles – deny Jesus is Lord vs. Caesar

This Letter was written to encourage believers to hold on to Jesus and to give warnings of the consequences of falling away.

How shall we escape if we neglect such a great salvation?
Hebrews 2:3

The persecution of Christians in parts of the world is at near "genocide" levels, according to a report ordered by Foreign Secretary Jeremy Hunt.

The review, led by the Bishop of Truro the Right Reverend Philip Mounstephen, estimated that one in three people suffer from religious persecution.

Christians were the most persecuted religious group, it found.

Mr Hunt said he felt that "political correctness" had played a part in the issue not being confronted.


# Things to do and things to avoid

Christ is faithful over God's house as a son. And we are his house, if indeed we hold fast our confidence and our boasting in our hope. Therefore, as the Holy Spirit says, "Today, if you hear his voice, do not harden your hearts as in the rebellion, on the day of testing in the wilderness, where your fathers put me to the test and saw my works for forty years. Hebrews 3:6-9



About this we have much to say, and it is hard to explain, since you have become dull of hearing. For though by this time you ought to be teachers, you need someone to teach you again the basic principles of the oracles of God. You need milk, not solid food, for everyone who lives on milk is unskilled in the word of righteousness, since he is a child. But solid food is for the mature, for those who have their powers of discernment trained by constant practice to distinguish **good from evil.** Hebrews 5:11-14







## No coming back from apostacy?

For it is **impossible**, in the case of those who have once been enlightened, who have tasted the heavenly gift, and have shared in the Holy Spirit, and have tasted the goodness of the word of God and the powers of the age to come, and then have fallen away, **to restore them** again to repentance, since they are crucifying once again the Son of God to their own harm and holding him up to contempt.

Hebrews 6:4



Therefore, brothers, since we have confidence to enter the Holy Place by the blood of Jesus, by the new and living way that he opened for us through the curtain, that is, through his flesh, and since we have a Great Priest over the house of God, let us draw near with a true heart in full assurance of faith, with our hearts sprinkled clean from an evil conscience and our bodies washed with pure water.

Hebrews 10:19-29





Let us **hold fast** the confession of our hope without wavering, for he who promised is faithful. And let us consider how to **stir up one another** to love and good works, **not neglecting to meet together**, as is the habit of some, but **encouraging one another**, and all the more as you see the Day drawing near. Hebrews 10:23-25



For if we **go** on sinning deliberately after receiving the knowledge of the truth, there no longer remains a sacrifice for sins, but a fearful expectation of judgment, and a fury of fire that will consume the adversaries.




Therefore, since we are surrounded by so great a cloud of witnesses, let us also lay aside every weight, and sin which clings so closely, and let us run with endurance the race that is set before us, looking to Jesus, the founder and perfecter of our faith, who for the joy that was set before him endured the cross, despising the shame, and is seated at the right hand of the throne of God. Consider him who endured from sinners such hostility against himself, so that you may not grow weary or fainthearted. Hebrews 12:1-3

Hebrews 12:12-13




**Strive for peace** with everyone, and for the **holiness** without which no one will see the Lord. Hebrews 12:14
