


The resurrection and Sadducees do not mix




The Rogues Gallery

Then Peter, filled with the Holy Spirit, said to them...




Notice how the Spirit worked

"It is by the name of Jesus Christ of Nazareth, whom you crucified but whom God raised from the dead, that this man stands before you healed."




It's in the BOOK

"Salvation is found in no one else, for there is no other name under heaven given to men by which **we** must be saved."



When they saw the **courage** of Peter and John and realized that they were unschooled, ordinary men, they were astonished




When they saw the courage of Peter and John and realized that they were unschooled, ordinary men, they were astonished and they took note that these men had been with Jesus.



The essential qualification


Lost for words??

Corrupt council


"What are we going to do with these men?" they asked. "Everybody living in Jerusalem knows they have done an outstanding miracle, and we cannot deny it."

But to stop **this thing** from **spreading** any further among the people, we must warn these men to speak no longer to anyone in this name."






It's an order from the government authorities

Then they called them in again and commanded them not to speak or teach at all in the name of Jesus.




When it is the right thing to disobey

Witnesses of the events and teaching


For we cannot (help) speaking about what we have seen and heard."



Jesus had commanded them to speak!


The Holy Spirit enabled them
