Esther 3:7-15

In the twelfth year of King Xerxes, in the first month, the month of Nisan, they cast the 'pur' (that is, the lot) in the presence of Haman to select a day and month. And the lot fell on the twelfth month, the month of Adar. Then Haman said to King Xerxes, "There is a certain people dispersed and scattered among the peoples in all the provinces of your kingdom whose customs are different from those of all other people and who do not obey the king's laws; it is not in the king's best interest to tolerate them. If it pleases the king, let a decree be issued to destroy them, and I will put ten thousand talents of silver into the royal treasury for the men who carry out this business." So the king took his signet ring from his finger and gave it to Haman son of Hammedatha, the Agagite, the enemy of the Jews. "Keep the money," the king said to Haman, "and do with the people as you please."



Then on the thirteenth day of the first month the royal secretaries were summoned. They wrote out in the script of each province and in the language of each people all Haman's orders to the king's satraps, the governors of the various provinces and the nobles of the various peoples. These were written in the name of King Xerxes himself and sealed with his own ring. Dispatches were sent by couriers to all the king's provinces with the order to destroy, kill and annihilate all the Jews--young and old, women and little children--on a single day, the thirteenth day of the twelfth month, the month of Adar, and to plunder their goods. Proverbs 6:33: The lot is cast into the lap, but its every decision is from the LORD.


Defamation of character

They are a 'certain people' – nobodies really (just a few?)


They've got everywhere.

Not many had returned to the land of Israel.



They are different – half a truth

whose customs are different from those of all other people and who do not obey the king's laws;



They are disobedient

- another lie – just because Mordechai won't worship Haman!

Having recently lost the war the Jews would also provide a convenient group to blame!

it is not in the king's best interest to tolerate them.

They are spoiling your reign

Your toleration (good king!) is not good for you!

Intolerable

Not tolerable; not capable of being borne or endured; not proper or right to be allowed; insufferable; insupportable; unbearable; as, intolerable pain; intolerable burden.

Life is cheap! Destroy!

If it pleases the king, let a decree be issued to destroy them,



What you should do!

Notice Haman's deference

- 'if it pleases the king'

My idea becomes your idea.

and I will put ten thousand talents of silver into the royal treasury for the men who carry out this business.

It won't cost you – I'll pay (to be collected from the loot!)

Evil usually finds the funding.

It's a very large sum. Also known as a bribe – just in case the king hesitates



The king agrees

So the king took his signet ring from his finger and gave it to Haman son of Hammedatha, the Agagite, the enemy of the Jews.



The Signet ring makes royal signatures

Power is in the hands of Haman

– full name =Amalekite, **the enemy**(hostile, unrepentant hatred = the wicked)



It's my signature - I'll pay

"Keep the money," the king said to Haman, "and do with the people as you please."

I don't want your money!



(the loot can go to the treasury!)

Go ahead with your plan.

It would have pleased him!

No delay – Haman's lucky number

These are the 'civil servants' - linguists


Get it written into law

things going wrong!




He dictated – they translated


Persian post!

Money, money, money!


and to plunder their goods.

They can all understand. There are no exceptions.


This would also 'flush out' the enemies.
