We are meant to be impressed with his generosity!



Somebody is trying to kill me

Then Queen Esther answered, "If I have found favour with you, O king, and if it pleases your majesty, grant me my life--this is my petition. v3




Observe the correct protocol

It's a favour she needs.

It is personal – spare my life.

And it's not just me...

And spare my people--this is my request. v3



She is Jewish and so are 'my people'.


This is a call for mercy.

This is the problem

It wouldn't have been right to bother you

Who is he?

Notice that he assumes it is a man.

He responded in the way Esther had hoped.

He could have ignored it as a trivial matter – "She's getting worried over nothing."

Esther said, "The adversary and enemy is this vile Haman." v6




Vile = evil = wicked

Just as the king returned from the palace garden to the banquet hall, Haman was falling on the couch where Esther was reclining. v8




This is another apparent coincidence. It looks bad to the king, as if Haman is trying to get revenge on her.

What the king thinks.


The king exclaimed,

"He had it made for Mordecai, who spoke up to help the king." v9




It seems that Harbona doesn't like Haman.

The Proverb fulfilled.


The king said, "Hang him on it!" v10

God's justice – the punishment fits the crime.


So they hanged Haman on the gallows he had prepared for Mordecai. v10
