The point of what we are saying is this.. 
The divided peoples of Israel would be re-united under this covenant.

It was given to the Jewish people and the gentiles.

John 10:16 And I have other sheep that are not of this fold. I must bring them also, and they will listen to my voice. So there will be one flock, one shepherd.

Hosea 1:9 And the LORD said, "Call his name Not My People, for you are not my people, and I am not your God."

Romans 11:1-2 Task, then, has God rejected his people? By no means! For I myself am an Israelite, a descendant of Abraham, a member of the tribe of Benjamin. God has not rejected his people whom he foreknew.






How can God forget our sins?
