Paul, a servant of God and an apostle of Jesus Christ for the faith of God's elect and the knowledge of the truth that leads to godliness-- a faith and knowledge resting on the hope of eternal life, which God, who does not lie, promised before the beginning of time, and at his appointed season he brought his word to light through the preaching entrusted to me by the command of God our Saviour,

To Titus, my true son in our common faith.. Grace and peace from God the Father and Christ Jesus our Saviour.

The reason I left you in Crete was that you might straighten out what was left unfinished and appoint elders in every town, as I directed you.

### When was the letter to Titus written?


It was probably written about same time as 1 Timothy for reasons to be explained later.



That would be about 62 AD

#### Who wrote it?


Paul, a servant of God and an apostle of Jesus Christ



A man well known to both Timothy and Titus as their beloved mentor.


## Where was it written from?

We don't know



### Where was it addressed?

#### Crete





Paul had been there evangelising with Titus, but he wasn't there then.

Crete was notorious at this time for its 'permissive culture'

i.e. - unrestrained sin

#### Who it was written to:

To Titus, my true son in our common faith

An affectionate description A real fellow believer!



#### What we know about Titus

Titus is referred to in Paul's letters
He was a Gentile (Galatians 2:3)
He was a highly competent and trusted worker

2 Corinthians 8:23 As for Titus, he is my partner and co-worker among you; as for our brothers, they are representatives of the churches and an honour to Christ.

Paul had him organise the Corinthian collection for the poor believers in Jerusalem. 2 Corinthians 8:16 ?

A mystery - he is not referred to in Acts. It has been suggested that he might have been Luke's brother.

## **A Timing Puzzle**

The letters 1 & 2 Timothy and Titus are not set in the context of Acts which concludes with Paul's house arrest and pending trial. (Acts 28:30)



It appears that Paul was released after the trial and went on to begin his 4<sup>th</sup> missionary journey.

# The 4<sup>th</sup> Missionary Journey.

Where he went to we do not know in any detail but as Titus 1:5 suggests, he must have visited Crete with Titus.

We can assume he left Crete for some reason before the churches were fully established, but where he went we do not know.



#### What is the letter about?

The content of the letter has parallels with 1 Timothy concerning dealing with the threat of false teaching and setting order for churches and the daily lives of believers.

Get things straight!




The churches in Crete are still quite young, having no appointed leaders. The dangerous false teachers were still outside the church, and the permissive culture was toxic to faithful living.

#### The intended audience

It appears that Paul was not in either Ephesus (1 Timothy) or Crete (Titus) but that he wrote these personal letters to his two workers. The letters were also intended to be read to the congregations, perhaps to support the authority of Timothy and Titus in dealing with the ongoing issues.





## Paul gives a long introduction

Paul, a servant of God and an apostle of Jesus Christ

He is The Real author
It is a humble, servant role
It is a privileged position 'Appointed and Sent! By the Lord Jesus'

Notice the unusual term Paul uses 'servant of GOD'

Along with term 'apostle', Paul is emphasising his authority and the link with Bible history in contrast to the false teachers he will refer to later in the letter.





In their time - the time of his choosing He revealed his plan - his word (plan) made known





God saves - What a blessing to be able to say He is "our" God!





## **Amazing blessings**


Grace and peace from God the Father and Christ Jesus our Saviour.

God's Son – our Saviour – he carried it out




## The reason I left you in Crete

(Why doesn't he tell Titus how?)

He has a Church structure in mind— Good governance is a help to the members and for the work of outreach
